GOALS FOR THE NEW YEAR

Now that the Holidays are over, the Stratmoor Hills Water and Sanitation Districts are preparing for an exciting new year.

An additional operator position has been approved that will provide us the resources to perform additional sewer maintenance "inhouse" this year. This will allow us to clean and inspect much of



our sewer collection system without having to rely on a contractor to do it. This will also provide enough staffing to create two separate crews, capable of responding to water and sewer emergencies in a more efficient manner.

The board is considering an agreement with Colorado Springs Utilities (CSU) to help ensure the water district has a backup water supply in case it is ever needed. This will include constructing a new interconnect facility that will adhere to current design and construction standards. This will be paid for using American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant funding that has already been approved.

These are only a few of the changes that will help us improve in 2024, and we look forward to providing our customers with safe and reliable water and sewer services for years to come!

Cold Weather Reminder

Please make certain any exposed water pipe is well insulated or drained. Garden hoses should be disconnected from faucets and sprinkler lines should be drained. It is also helpful to know the location of the water shut off valve to your home in case a pipe does break.
